<b>The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity</b>	<p>Y6 and TAs are being used to engage children in greater physical activities during playtimes. Equipment has been bought to provide support for this. Sports Leaders have also been used to engage children in greater physical activities and support the KS2 Barnet Virtual skipping challenges.</p> <p>'Non-Stop Action' bags have been bought for Reception classes to support parents in doing physical activities at home and a workshop was delivered to the children. The children take the bag of equipment home for the weekend and bring it back on Monday and talk about using the bag. Some parents were able to take pictures of their activities. Next year we want this to extend to Y1.</p> <p>All Y4 swim all year and 96% could swim without aids by the end of the year, 52% could swim at least 25m.</p> <p>(Need to show Y6 swimming figures and maybe use one term swimming for catch up)</p> <p>Children understand the importance of keeping active both in and out of school. Some children attend an 'Active Fun Club' once a week before school.</p> <p>A playground 'Four Square' competition for KS2 has been run by a teacher at playtimes which generates great enthusiasm.</p> <p>Adults have been supporting skipping in the KS1 playground with great success, particularly with Y2. <p><b>The profile of PE and Sport being raised across the school as tool for whole school improvement</b></p>	<p>A large group of children from Y3 to Y6 participated in the Barnet Athletics Competition at the Allianz Park Stadium. They attended an athletics club to prepare them for this and they also continued to practise at home. Bell Lane won the boys high jump and many children got into the track finals.</p> <p>Y6 competed in the Sportshall Athletics event and Y5 competed in the Quadkids athletics competition. Most of these children were competing for the first time in a competition and performed very well. The Y5 children will be able to build on their experience and compete in this competition as Y6 All sporting achievements are celebrated in assemblies with certificates and medals when appropriate.</p> <p>Pupils performed well at the annual Dance Festival at the Arts Depot to a large audience and then performed their dance in an assembly back at school</p> <p>A good camera was bought to capture skills more precisely during lessons and to record completions and events. <p><b>Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff teaching PE and sport</b></p>	<p>Through buying into the BPSS, the PE subject leader was able to attend the PE subject leader training which has led to EYFS using the 'Non Stop Action Bags' A workshop was delivered by 'Non Stop Action' to support Early Years in how to use a wide range of equipment in different ways. BPSS have also enabled many children to enter competitions in a range of sports including the Boccia competition for the first time.</p> <p>'All for Sport' specialist leaders in PE have been used to support teachers throughout the school. 	<p>A new online scheme called 'Complete PE' has been purchased to support planning and assessment for the whole school. <p><b>Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils</b></p>	<p>Some KS2 SEND children participated in a sports event at the Allianz Park Stadium for the first time and showed great enthusiasm. This BBN1 event allowed children to try indoor rowing, tennis, cricket, long jump, dance and golf. A group of SEND children also attended a Boccia competition for the first time and were awarded the fair play award.</p> <p>Children are enthusiastic about joining clubs; a gymnastics club was run to prepare children for a gymnastics competition and there was greater participation in an athletics club. Resources have been bought to support these clubs and a wider range of sports including a gymnastics wedge to support forward and backward rolls, golf equipment and a Boccia set of balls. Resources have also been bought to support KS2 Sports Day and for the Active Fun Club.</p> <p>KS2 Sports Day took place at Hendon Park for the first time in July 2018 and again in July 2019 with field and track events. Parents helped to run this event and it proved very successful . 	<p>For the first time, a group of SEND children competed in a Boccia tournament and received the fair play award. Children also competed in gymnastics, Sportshall athletics and QuadKids athletics and South Barnet Athletics Competition. Bell Lane won the boys high jump event. Y6 also competed in the golf competition.</p> <p>Many children chose to compete in Virtual Skipping challenges. This allows students to develop on a personal challenge, as well as a competitive aspect as their results are compared against other schools.
